

TAVAC is dedicated to help VAC's and other transition professionals better serve their students by providing the necessary training, support and other resources to guide them through the transition process.

#### WHAT IS A VAC?

A VAC is a Vocational Adjustment Coordinator, a teacher who helps students develop and practice vocational readiness skills. The VAC's goal is to maximize each student's self confidence, self advocacy ability and capacity to think and work independently. This allows the student to reach their fullest potential in the workplace.

#### TAVAC HISTORY

TAVAC was established in 1966 as a professional organization to train and support VAC's, Transition Specialists, Job Coaches, Vocational Counselors, and others tasked with helping students with disabilities transition from high school to a fulfilling work experience. Through annual conferences, TAVAC has played an increasingly effective role in providing professional development to those involved in the vocational training and transition of students with disabilities.

#### **TAVAC PURPOSE**

- To aid in promoting the total development of students with special needs.
- To promote professional growth through state wide conferences and local meetings.
- To enhance communication.
- To promote a synergized effort in support of students with special needs.
- To provide policies which affect educators, students and their programs in general.
- To establish a statewide organization to provide a unified voice supporting the transition of disabled students.

#### **VAC CERTIFICATION PROGRAM**

TAVAC offers the state's only certification program for VAC's. This is earned by attaining 60 hours of in-service training in areas such as Job Development, Student Placement, Job-site Training and Vocational Assessment.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

In 1979, the TAVAC Scholarship program was initiated to assist special education students participating in a vocational program with the cost of continuing their education or career training. Annually, TAVAC awards numerous scholarships totaling thousands of dollars to deserving transition students throughout the state.
